CONSENT ORDER

PURSUANT TO RULE 29 (1) and (2) of The Tribunal Procedure (First Tier Tribunal) (Health, Education and Social Care Chamber) Rules 2008, and UPON the agreement by the parties that there are no findings of fact against the Appellant in relation to the complaints giving rise to the Respondent's decision not to include her in its Medical Performers List,

BY CONSENT IT IS ORDERED THAT:-

1. The appeal of the Appellant is allowed to the extent that she be afforded conditional inclusion in the Respondent's Medical Performers List, subject to the following conditions:-
 - (i) To work in a training practice, accredited for GP training by the General Medical Council of the United Kingdom, or its equivalent, such placement to be identified by the Post Graduate Dean and approved by the Respondent's Medical Director on the basis of:
 - (a) 2-3 days per week in an agreed training practice, for a period of approximately 3 - 6 months;
 - (b) A progress review to take place at the 3 month stage, progress to be assessed by measure of a GP trainer's report to the Respondent's Medical Director.
 - (c) To confine any concurrent medical practice to General Practice posts (including locums) as a salaried GP, excluding out of hours services work, such posts to be agreed in advance by the Respondent's Medical Director.
 - (ii) The appointment of a workplace supervisor responsible for educational feedback regarding the Appellant's work as a General Medical Practitioner
 - (iii) The Appellant to notify the Respondent's Medical Director of the name of the workplace supervisor.
 - (iv) The Appellant to engage with and within a 6 month period satisfactorily complete a GP appraisal in accordance with the Respondent's policy (and the guidelines on appraisals published by the GMC).

- (v) The Appellant to satisfactorily complete a validated Patient Satisfaction Survey, such as GPAQ.

- (vi) The Appellant to notify the Respondent's Medical Director of any complaints about her medical practice within one working day of the complaint coming to her attention.

2. At the conclusion of the 6 month period, the Respondent will review the conditions imposed upon the Appellant's inclusion in its Medical Performers List to consider whether conditional inclusion remains appropriate and will take whatever action it deems appropriate, in the light of that review, under the National Health Service (Performers Lists) Regulations 2004.
